LAST WEEK

Clark came up short against non-conference opponent Fitchburg State on Tuesday, 10-5. Junior **Nicholas Tapper** went 3-for-5 with a run scored. Sophomores **Cole Osburn** and **Eric Dufour** hit back-to-back home runs in the top of the third. Senior **David Hanley** hit a two-run single in the top of the ninth.

The Cougars fell in non-conference action to Elms College 8-6 on Thursday. Junior **Kyle Breidenstine** and senior **Scott Archibald** each finished 2 for 4 for the Cougars. Archibald recorded two RBI.

Clark dropped another close one on Saturday falling to nationally ranked Wheaton College 8-5 in game one of a NEWMAC double-header. The Cougars lost 17-8 in game two. Junior **Robert Muollo, Jr.** hit a two-run single off the bench in game one. He went 3-for-6 in game two with two runs scored. Dufour had a triple, a run scored and an RBI. ATHLETIC DEPARTMENT NEWS

Joe Brady to Assume New Position in the Clark Athletic Department

Clark University Athletic Director Linda Moulton recently announced that Joseph Brady, the Head Women's Soccer Coach/Sports Information Director for the last five years will serve as intramural director beginning in August as well as assume additional administrative responsibilities. He will continue to direct the women's soccer program.

Clark will begin a search for a full-time Sports Information Director immediately.

Brady directed the soccer program to the 2005 ECAC Championship game and finished as runner-up. The women's soccer team finished the 2005 season 12-8-1 and reached the ECAC finals for the first time in the program's history. The 12 wins are the most since 1999 and Clark's third-place finish in the conference is the best since 1999. The Cougars reached the NEWMAC semifinals for the second straight year and fell 2-0 to second seed and eventual NEWMAC Champion Springfield College.

Cougars fell to conference foe MIT 6-1. First-year **Ben Gross** won the lone point for the Cougars at the number six singles position (6-2, 6-0).
