Glad to hear from you
again.

Our 9 oared shell awaits
you in the Wild Boat House. It
was built by Lutz in 1930 and
is in fair condition. Ask for
Blake Dennison at the Wild. He is
the man in charge and knows about
the boat.

The best way to move an
8 is by truck - preferably a fairly
high one so that the bow of the 8
can project out over the front of
the truck while the stern and
middle are supported by a temporary
wooden structure erected in the body
of the truck. The truck itself should
be high so that the 8 will be above
the average curious automobile.

We don't have any extra
oars. You can get good oars
called "seconds" from George
Poock - ten for \$100⁰⁰ - or perhaps
cheaper if you write him. And
I don't know where you can get
second-hand riggers & locks. We

to the war such things are very
scarce.

In any event you are
certainly getting rowing started
nicely and here's hoping the
sport will continue at Clark.
Worcester used to be a real
rowing town and should be
again.
