Dear Mr. Nunnemacher:

Thank you very much for your letter. I am sorry that you are having Radcliffe trouble in getting regular rowing practice with your girls. Mine I fear is worse than usual. For one thing, Browne and Nichols decided to use their third shell which I have had for the last two years, so that we have had nothing but the barge for rowing. Also, the weather as you know has been most uncooperative. If you are willing to take us as we are, and not be shocked by the results, I should still like to try to put through our plan.

It would be better I think to row in the eights, and I could never get more than just one eight and a cox, if that. The 4:30 time will be all right for us. I will check up on my eight girls this Friday and if it is going to be impossible, let you know immediately if there is any change.

Your choice of judges is fine. I should like to have this go through this spring if possible, to get the idea started - even if the results are not the way we might wish it. That will allow room for improvement.

If you could please send me your telephone number then I can call you on May 12 if there should be any doubt about the weather.
