Clark Crew Bows to Brown

Clark University's eight-oared crew rowed one of its finest races but was beaten by Brown, and Shrewsbury High came up with a victory over the Brown Freshmen Saturday as the rowing season got under way on Lake Quinsigamond.

The defeat of the Clark varsity clouded the christening of the Scarlet's new shell by Mrs. Carl Luebbe of Hopedale in honor of her son Ensign Herbert Luebbe, a former Clark oarsman who lost his life in the Pacific in January, 1945.

Clark, while rowing the mile and a quarter course under seven minutes for the first time this early in the season, was beaten by a length and three quarters. The Bruins, leading all the way, were timed in 6:52 and Clark in 6:59.

Shrewsbury High's varsity had almost a full two lengths on the Brown Freshmen at the finish of their one-mile race. Shrewsbury, opening its season on a winning note, was timed in 5:26 and the Bruin Cubs in 5:34.

Shrewsbury's Jayvees beat the Clark Jayvees in a three-quarter mile race.
