# Clark Crew Beaten By Amherst

SOUTH HADLEY—The Amherst varsity crew pulled away in the sprint run to defeat Clark University's crew by two lengths on the upstream mile course on the Connecticut River here Saturday.

Amherst was clocked in 6.57, and Clark in 7.05, excellent times for both crews according to veteran rowing enthusiasts here. The five-mile-an-hour current makes for a tough pull upstream and average good times generally fall between seven minutes and 7.10.

### Amherst Sprints

Clark's improving varsity spent itself in trying to make up water shortly before the two shells moved into the last quarter mile. Then Amherst sprinted and pulled away from a half-length lead into its ultimate two-length victory.

Amherst took an early lead but Clark pulled up even at the half-mile mark and the race seasawed thereafter until the final minute.

The Clark Jayvee crew turned in a half-length victory over Amherst's lightweights. The Clark boat was clocked in 7.47, two seconds better than Amherst.

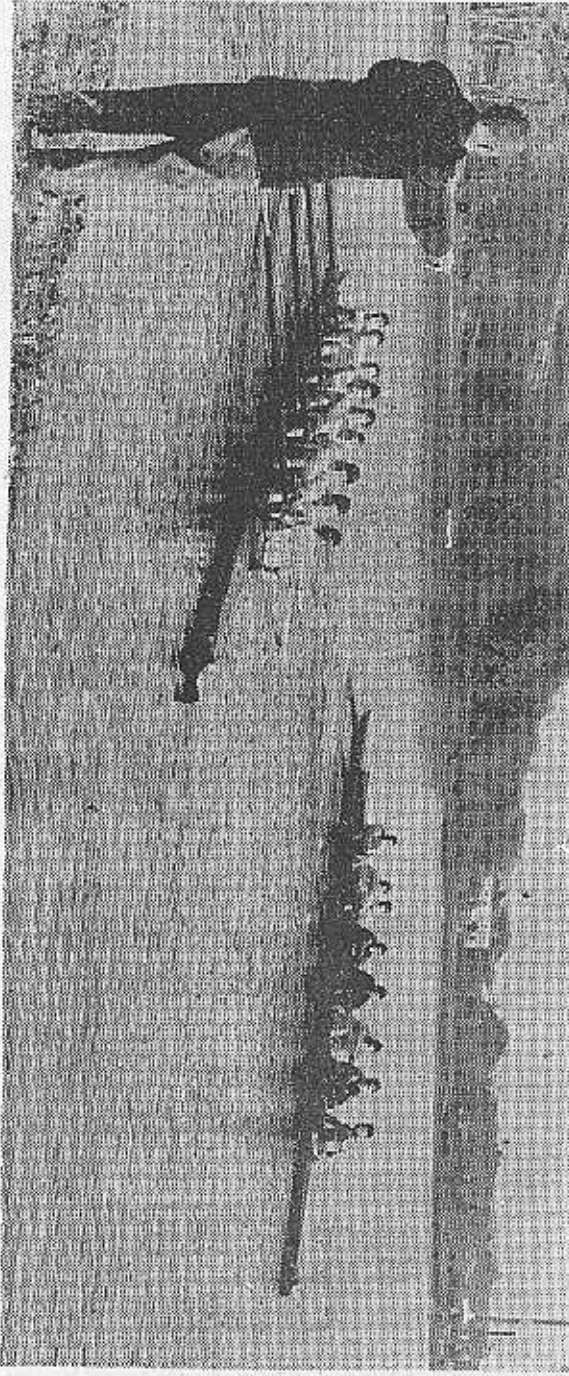
