AIC CREW WINS OVER CLARK ON MATCH ON CONN.

Aces Victory by Three Lengths; JV Shell Also Is Victor

American International College crews swept the Connecticut River yesterday as varsity and junior varsity boats won. AIC varsity defeated Clark by three lengths in the time of 6:20 in the mile and 5-18 test. AIC JVs defeated LaSalle freshmen and Clark JVs by two lengths in time of 5:50 over a mile course. LaSalle was second. LaSalle was invited to participate while its varsity crew rowed at Amherst. It was the Aces' first victory in the North. They were nosed out by Brown last week by three feet. Brown Crews Win Over Clark Eights

PROVIDENCE—Brown University's varsity eight-oared shell defeated Clark University of Worcester, Mass., by some seven lengths on extremely choppy Seekonk River yesterday.

Brown covered the mile and five sixteenths in 9:13. Clark finished in 9:43.

The Brown Jayvees also won, defeating the Clark Jayvees by 10 lengths as they traveled a mile course in 5:52.

Both races were conducted against a 16 mile an hour head wind.

It was the fourth loss without a victory for each of the Clark crews.

Harvard's 150 Crew Easily Beats Clark

WORCESTER, April 28 (AP)—A Harvard lightweight crew, rated as only the Crimson's third best, easily defeated Clark University's heavyweight varsity today on Lake Quinsigamond.

The Harvard crew was clocked in 7:23.3 for the mile and a quarter race while finishing three lengths ahead of Clark.

Beaten by
Dartmouth
Clark University's varsity eight-oared shell lost by eight feet to the Dartmouth second lightweight freshmen yesterday afternoon at Lake Quinsigamond.
The Dartmouth boat covered the mile and a quarter distance in 7:26.2, eight-tenths of a second faster than the Scarlet.
The Clark jayvees, however, gained their first victory in five races, increasing their lead from the start to one and a quarter lengths at the finish in defeating the Dartmouth mixed freshman crew. Clark's time over a mile course was 8:32.0, five seconds ahead of Dartmouth.
The Clark varsity, absorbing its fifth setback in as many races, gained a quick lead at the start, but Dartmouth took over midway down the course and held a slight edge the rest of the way.

The Clark crews will race next against AIC here Tuesday.
