Harvard Crews Top Clark at Lake, Tabor, Shrewsbury Split 2 Races

Harvard University's lightweight crews dominated the Regatta on Lake Quinsigamond yesterday by easily whipping Clark University's varsity and junior varsity eights, Tabor Academy put on a terrific spurt over the last half mile to beat Shrewsbury High varsity by three lengths.

Shrewsbury High's second crew came through in the final race of the day to easily whip Tabor's second crew by four lengths. It was a mild surprise for the Shrewsbury roofers as the boat consisted of six freshmen. The Colonials broke in front and stayed all the way, hitting the quarter mile mark in 1:35, the half in 3:30, three quarters, 5:05, and the finish line in 6:35.

Clark's Varsity eight held on gamely with the Harvard third varsity lightweights but couldn't match the Crimson boat over the last half mile of the one mile and one-quarter event. Harvard got off to a good start and hit the half mile mark in 2 minutes and 55 seconds to lead the local crew by one boat length. However, Clark couldn't match the smooth stroking Crimson eight and steadily fell behind. Harvard crossed the finish marker three lengths in front in 7:23.3. Clark's time was 7:34.

Clark's Jayvee crew was little match for the Harvard second freshmen lightweights as the boys from Cambridge raced off by 10 lengths in 5:51.

In the most exciting race of the afternoon, Tabor Academy's varsity eight pulled away in the final half mile to lick the Shrewsbury High Varsity by three lengths. Both boats raced evenly for the first quarter mile. At the halfway mark Tabor managed to go in front slightly and then steadily increased its lead over the last half mile to win in 5:20. Shrewsbury's time for the mile was 5:37.

Coach Ken Burns of Shrewsbury was extremely pleased

with the showing of the varsity as the boat cut 13 seconds off its best time to date. The Clark and Shrewsbury eights have had less than two weeks on Lake Quinsigamond because of the late breaking of the ice.
