

## Clark Crew Rows Fordham Today

The Clark University eight-oared crew will race Fordham University this afternoon at 5 o'clock at Travers Island, N.Y., and then depart for Philadelphia where the shell will engage in the Dad Vail Regatta on the Schuylkill River on Saturday.

Sixteen college crews will compete on Saturday.

Three heats will eliminate 10 crews in morning trials. The championship race will take place at 3:30 p.m.

Clark will face Amherst, Florida Southern, LaSalle and Purdue in the first heat at 9:30 a.m.

## 3 Harvard Crews Defeat Shrewsbury and Clark Eights

Harvard crews didn't exactly "sweep the river" yesterday but they did a pretty fair job of mopping up Lake Quinsigamond.

Three of the lesser known Crimson boats not only rowed to victories over Shrewsbury High and Clark University crews, but they showed unusual smoothness and turned in eye-catching times in their onesided triumphs.

Harvard's Third Freshman boat rowed a 5:09 mile in whipping Shrewsbury by three lengths. The Crimson, leading all the way, increased their advantage gradually as the race progressed. Shrewsbury had a commendable 5:21 time.

That was the top performance but Harvard's Fourth Freshman boat had a 5:14 clocking in whipping the Clark Jayvees by something like 12 or 13 lengths.

## Shrewsbury Crew Wins As Amherst Outrows Clark

Shrewsbury High's crew won for the first time while two Clark University eights lost in a regatta at Lake Quinsigamond yesterday.

The Scarlets' varsity eight rowed its second fastest race ever in losing to the Amherst varsity, the Clark junior varsity bowed to the Amherst jayvees and Shrewsbury whipped the Amherst freshmen.

Shrewsbury covered a mile in 5 minutes, 49 seconds to easily win its race.

The Clark varsity spurred in the final quarter of a mile in an attempt to overhaul the Lord Jeffs, but were forced to accept a one and one-quarter length defeat. Amherst was timed in 6:43 for the mile and a quarter distance, Clark in 6:52. The Scarlets' best previous time was 6:43 last

year. The Amherst jayvees won by five lengths in their mile race. They were timed in 5:36, Clark in 5:56.
