Harvard's University's Third Freshman boat turned in 5:09 mile to beat Shrewsbury High by three lengths yesterday on Lake Quinsigamond.

Harvard's Third Varsity whipped the Clark University crew easily in 6:45, or a margin of 23 seconds.

To complete a sweep, the Harvard Fourth Freshmen oarsmen pulled to victory over Clark Jayvees by a dozen boat lengths and almost a full minute.

Clark Crew Breaks
Lake Ice to Work Out

Crewmen are usually dedicated individuals — a characteristic Clark University's rowers showed this week.

Anxious to start workouts, the Scarlets began their drills last Monday after a powerboat shattered enough ice at Lake Quinsigamond to provide a channel.

Dr. Eugene Melder, who is coaching Clark again after a year's absence to study on a fellowship in England, is hopeful that the Scarlets will have a successful campaign.

Optimistic

"We should be as strong as our best crews in the past if we get some breaks from the weather and if we can recruit an adequate junior varsity group," the former University of Washington oarsman said.

"By breaks I mean no more ice on the Lake.

"We need a strong junior varsity to push the varsity in our

workouts and to provide the basic training experience to supply oarsmen for future varsity crews."

Need 3 Replacements

Melder also will be striving to find replacements for Ed Kinell, Angie Scola and Art Lee, who helped Clark to a successful campaign a year ago when Ken Burns, Shrewsbury High crew coach, was in charge.

Diverting a moment from this season's prospects, Melder said: "Ken did a fine job last year with a small crew that had only 10 to 12 men. Clark pushed AIC to a new home course record of 6:42 in losing by a few feet, defeated Fordham handily and lost close races to Amherst and Brown.

"In the Dad Vail regatta at Philadelphia, Clark broke into the first division by defeating Amherst, Marietta and Purdue."

Returning this season from that fine outfit are Captain George Collins, Joe Behrman, Neil Barton, Carl Erickson, Alan Wabrek and coxswain Stuart Miller.

In a practice race against Boston University last fall, Duncan McLean, Richard Parslow and Steve Brown impressed Melder. SPRINGFIELD — Two Clark University crews and the Shrewsbury High varsity were defeated in eight-oared races yesterday on the Connecticut River.

American International College's varsity defeated the Scarlets' first eight by two and a half lengths in a mile and a quarter race. AIC was timed in 5:38 and Clark in 5:48.

It was Clark's second loss in two races.

The AIC junior varsity won by three lengths over its Clark counterpart.

Shrewsbury, making its first 1968 start, lost by one length to Springfield Technical High in a mile race. Tech was time in 4:50 and Shrewsbury in 4:54.
