# Clark Loses By 9 Lengths To Fordham

NEW YORK — Fordham's varsity crew handed Clark University its sixth straight defeat yesterday at Travers Island. The Rams were nine lengths ahead when the shells passed the finish line.

Fordham was clocked in 6:15.5 for the 2000 meters (mile and a quarter) with Clark timed at 6:43.5.

The Rams nosed ahead by a length at the quarter-mile mark with coxwain Ed Collins calling for a 36 count. Collins took the Rams down to 34 at the half-mile mark with Fordham leading by two and a half lengths. The Fordham margin was five lengths after three-quarters of a mile with the Ram eight stroking at 32.

Rowing against a stiff tailwind, Clark gained a length and a half at the mile mark. The Worcester crew was hitting 34 to Fordham's 30. Collins moved the Rams up to 34 with 440 to go and they were rowing at a 38 count at the finish.

Fordham reversed its loss of last year to the same Clark crew. The Ram record now stands at 7:3 with Clark at 0:6. The boats face each other in the Dad Vail championships tomorrow in Philadelphia.

# Clark, Shrewsbury Crews Lose at Lake

The American International College eight oared crew of Springfield grabbed an early one length lead after a quarter of a mile and then steadily increased its margin to whip Clark University by 2½ lengths on rain swept Lake Quinsigamond yesterday afternoon.

It was the second time this season that AIC has beaten the Clark eight. The race was over the one mile and one quarter distance and the Springfield oarsmen hit the wire in seven minutes, .05 seconds. Clark's time was 7:17.

It was one of four races at the Lake yesterday.

Tabor Academy of Marion opened the four race card by licking the Shrewsbury High varsity by four lengths. Shrewsbury and Tabor stroked on even terms for the first quarter mile but the Colonials suddenly weakened as Tabor went to the front at the halfway mark by two and then seemed to get stronger and was going away by four at the finish of the mile test. Tabor was caught in five minutes, 42 seconds for the mile.

The Tabor Jayvees had little trouble downing the Shrewsbury Jayvees in another mile event. Tabor went to the front immediately and was going strongly at the wire.

The Clark Jayvees went down to defeat before the AIC Jayvees by better than two lengths in the fourth encounter. AIC went the mile in six minutes, eight seconds.

At the start of the Clark-AIC Jayvee affair, Clark stroke Len Jacobs broke an oar and the crews had to be recalled for a second start. After a new oar had been secured, AIC took over at the start and was never headed.

The Clark-AIC varsity race was a tossup until the big Springfield boat took over at the half and then coxwain Tony Pessolanto called on his oarsmen for just a little more and they responded willingly to capture the race handily. This same AIC shell lost a heart breaker to Harvard at Cambridge a week ago by one-tenth of a second.

Only a handful of spectators braved the cool wet wind that swept the course. Despite the rain and cool breeze, the water was termed satisfactory for rowing.
