

THE SEYMOUR N. LOGAN FACULTY FELLOWSHIP
-- Provisions and Procedures for Applying --

The Logan Faculty Fellowship program, through the generosity of the donors, includes:

1. Support for the faculty Logan Fellow to design a new undergraduate course (to be taught in the spring of 2008) that is innovative and accessible to a broad range of students (\$5,000 stipend for summer 2007);
2. Appointment of an undergraduate Logan Scholar to work with the faculty Fellow on course development and organization of a symposium related to the topic and theme of the course (\$2,000 summer stipend);
3. Support for a symposium during the 2008-09 academic year related to the topic and theme of the new course (\$3,000) and for a summer stipend (\$5,000) awarded to the Fellow (summer 2008) for the conference preparation period.

Eligibility: the Logan Fellowship is open to all full-time tenured and tenure-track and multi-year Clark faculty in the humanities (including visual and performing arts) and the social sciences.

Application: the application should be approximately 5 pages and include:

1. General description of the course proposed for development, including comments about purpose and goals, content, pedagogy;
2. Statement of the applicant's philosophy of teaching and evidence of teaching excellence, including teaching evaluations;
3. General description of the proposed symposium.

Applicants should also submit a current curriculum vitae and have a letter of support sent by their department chair. Chairs who apply should have a letter from another member of the department or, where applicable, the faculty member in the department who has major responsibility for the undergraduate program.

Deadline: Applications should be submitted to Judy Miller (CETL, Corner House) by April 2, 2007.

Selection Process: Applications will be reviewed by a committee appointed by the Provost, consisting of Shelly Tenenbaum, Anne Geller, Nancy Budwig, Doug Little, and Judy Miller (chair).
