ANNA GREENBERG, PH.D. has more than 20 years of experience polling in the political, nonprofit and academic sectors. She joined the polling and research firm GQR in 2001, after teaching public opinion and survey research methodology at Harvard University's John F. Kennedy School of Government.

She was the lead pollster in many successful local, state, and national political campaigns, and worked with former U.S. Rep. Gabrielle Giffords in her races for Congress. Greenberg continues to provide strategic advice to Giffords, and to the congresswoman's organization to prevent gun violence.

Greenberg works with a wide range of organizations on issues including women's health, LGBT rights, money in politics, faith and values, reducing gun violence, and reforming drug laws. A sought-after commentator, she regularly provides insights on politics to outlets including The New York Times, Washington Post, Politico, NPR, and the BBC.

Greenberg served on the board of the American National Election Study (ANES) from 2014 to 2017 and is currently a research fellow at American University's Center for Congressional and Presidential Studies. She holds a doctorate in political science from the University of Chicago.
