Corey Gomes



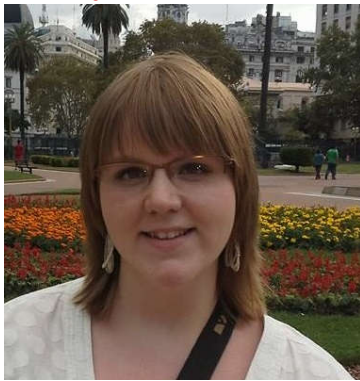

Connor Guerin



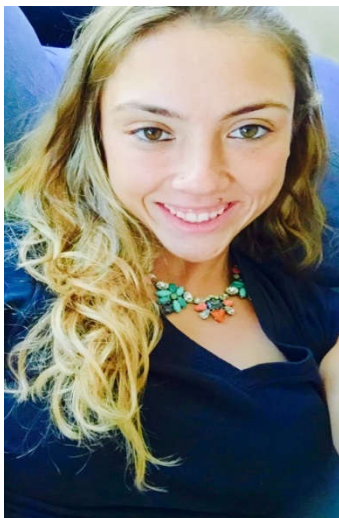
