Save the Date for a Presidential Lecture

Mark your calendars for "How Democracies Die," a <u>Presidential Lecture</u> featuring Harvard Professor Daniel Ziblatt, co-author of the bestselling book of the same name, on **Wednesday, Oct. 26**, at 5 p.m. in Tilton Hall.

Is our democracy in danger? In the bestselling "How Democracies Die," Ziblatt and his co-author, Steven Levitsky — who spent two decades studying the breakdown of democracies in Europe and Latin America — say they believe the answer is yes. Democracy no longer ends with a bang — in a revolution or military coup — but with a whimper: the slow, steady weakening of critical institutions, such as the judiciary and the press, and the gradual erosion of long-standing political norms.

Ziblatt's lecture will be livestreamed.

Mass Audubon Passes Available; Enter Raffle for Family Membership

Clark University has joined the Community Partners Program of the Massachusetts Audubon Society, the largest nature-based conservation organization in New England. This means that everyone in the Clark community can enjoy the benefits of Mass Audubon membership for free. Mass Audubon operates more than 60 wildlife sanctuaries with hundreds of trails, including the <u>Broad Meadow Brook Conservation Center and Wildlife</u> <u>Sanctuary</u> in Worcester. To borrow four reusable admission passes, good at any Mass Audubon sanctuary, for 72 hours, visit the Goddard Library Service Desk.

In addition to the individual passes, Clark also has five one-year **family memberships** (free wildlife sanctuary admission for up to two named adults in a household, and their children or grandchildren under the age of 21), and five **single-use family admission passes**, which we will distribute by a raffle — <u>enter by 5 p.m. on Friday, Sept. 23</u>.
