



**Winter Intersession FAQ
for
Arts & Sciences Undergraduate Students**

Q: Are intersession classes free?

A: If you were a full-time student (you registered for 3.0 units of credit or more) in the fall 2020 semester, you may register for 1.5 units during intersession for free.

Q: I was not a full-time student in the fall; do I have to pay for an intersession course?

A: If you were not registered as a full-time student in the fall, you must pay for your intersession course(s). Fall part-time students interested in taking intersession courses should contact Student Accounts at saccounts@clarku.edu for course costs and billing information.

Q: I registered for more than 4.5 units in the fall semester; can I still take 1.5 units during the intersession for free?

A: Yes.

Q: I registered for 3 or 4 fall courses, but completed only 2 (withdrew from the other[s]). Can I take intersession course(s) without being charged?

A: Yes, if you were registered as a full-time student by the end of the add/drop period, you may register for intersession courses for free.

Q: Are PINS required to register for intersession courses?

A: No, but you absolutely should consult with your advisor to ensure your choices work for your degree plan.

Q: I am an undergraduate Arts & Sciences student; can I take a course offered by the School of Professional Studies during the intersession?

A: No, undergraduate Arts & Sciences students cannot take any School of Professional Studies undergraduate courses during intersession.

Q: I am an undergraduate Arts & Sciences student who is in the Advanced Degree Program; can I take a graduate course during intersession for free if I was a full-time student in the fall?

A: Yes, A&S students can take a graduate course as part of their free 1.5 units. The faculty person for the course must issue the override to allow the student into the course. (For SPS graduate courses, it is the program that issues the overrides, rather than the instructors.)

Q: When does registration for intersession courses begin?

A: Registration for intersession courses for **all** students begins on Monday, November 16.

Q: When do intersession courses begin and end?

A: Intersession is six weeks. Classes begin on Monday, January 4 and end on Friday, February 12.

Q: When is the add/drop period for intersession courses?

A: The add/drop period for intersession courses is Monday, January 4 – Friday, January 8.

Q: Are all intersession courses online?

A: Yes.

Q: What are the meeting times for intersession courses?

A: Please see the chart below:

For 1 unit courses:
• If class meets 5 days a week: 1 hr 30 min per day
• If class meets 4 days a week: 1 hr 50 min per day
• If class meets 3 days a week: 2 hrs 30 min per day
For 0.5 unit courses:
• If class meets 5 days a week: 45 min per day
• If class meets 4 days a week: 1 hr per day
• If class meets 3 days a week: 1 hr 15 min per day
• If class meets 2 days a week: 1 hr 50 min
