

Our undergraduate programs are supported by multiple schools within the University. These specialized schools complement our liberal arts foundation with expert courses, faculty, speakers, and events.

College of Arts & Sciences

Most of Clark's undergraduate majors and minors are housed here, with disciplines as widespread as psychology, urban studies, economics, screen studies, and mathematical biology & bioinformatics.

School of Management (SOM)

Focused on business and social innovation, the School of Management is home to programs in management, marketing, and entrepreneurship and innovation. The School of Management is accredited by the Association to Advance Collegiate Schools of Business (AACSB), a distinction that only 5% of undergraduate business programs share. Students in the Arts & Sciences can double-major in these programs, creating an interdisciplinary degree with expert faculty mentorship and hands-on experience in the business world.

Becker School of Design & Technology (BSDT)

The Becker School of Design & Technology at Clark was founded in April 2021 to carry on the legacy of Becker College's world-renowned academic programs in game design, development, and interactive media. Our accredited interactive media major is ranked #2 in the world by The Princeton Review. The major offers five tracks that equip students with differentiating skills: game arts, game design, game development & programming, game production & management, and game audio.


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
