



Verto Education Equivalencies

Clark’s Direct Transfer partnership with Verto Education allows eligible students to earn guaranteed transfer admission to Clark through their performance during a Verto study abroad experience. All courses, credits, and transcripts at Verto locations are delivered by Verto’s accredited Academic Provider, the University of New Haven. The coursework below has been reviewed and articulated by Clark to our course offerings. Where no Clark course number and name listed, VERTO course will transfer as general elective credit toward the Clark degree. See special notes below.

* Academic credit at Clark is calculated in “units.” Most Clark courses are valued at one unit of credit, which is equivalent to four semester credit hours. Students typically enroll in four courses (four Clark units) each semester. 32 Clark units are required for graduation.
